Editor and Training Director's Notes – Hazel Olbrich

I just finished my last judging assignment for 2018 (Chicago, nice dogs, clear air, good hospitality by the club – and two of the best classic grilled cheese sandwiches I have eaten in a long time). I had a very large Open B class (about 30 dogs) and it was bittersweet to judge the command discrimination exercise, over and over, one that I associate so strongly with Lori Drouin.

One of the items that has made my life so crazy these last few months is a cousin who passed away unexpectedly and without a will (I'm still looking). The chore I have is to complete the inventory of her

estate by the end of the year --- wish me luck! Please, please, if you haven't done so yet, do something kind for your friends and family and leave a document outlining your wishes (and for heaven's sake, keep a copy of it outside your safe deposit box).

Private Lessons to Continue – Hazel Olbrich

As you know, Barbara Henry is retiring from offering private lessons for ODTC at the end of 2018. The club and her students owe her so much, and I hesitate to offer myself in her place. But I'm going to give it a whirl.

The ground rules for the new private lessons are changing. As you read them, you will see that I am not willing to devote much time to scheduling, so the ground rules are designed to minimize my scheduling activities. The goal for me is to set the schedule for an upcoming quarter and then not do any scheduling until the next quarter. Here are the ground rules.

- 1. In general, private lessons will be offered twice a month on the second and fourth Mondays of the month.
- 2. Lessons will be for ½ hour, first lesson at 10:30, last lesson at 1:00 (that is, six lessons on any given Monday). The times are set to minimize driving through traffic for everyone.
- 3. Cost for instruction is \$35 per half hour lesson.
- 4. The schedule of lessons will be set up quarterly in the month before the quarter (for example, the schedule for 1st quarter 2019 will be set by about December 15, 2018).
- 5. Once a person has been assigned a lesson slot, that student is responsible for assuring that ODTC gets paid for that slot. If a student can't make it, they can find a substitute if they wish. They will inform Hazel of the substitute or paid absence. Missing payment for an agreed-on lesson slot may result in that student not being assigned lesson slots in future.
- 6. The schedule for an upcoming quarter will be opened via an email to the official club list early in the month proceeding a new quarter. If the number of people wanting private lessons exceeds the number of slots, they will be assigned by lottery (I don't think first come first served is fair to all). A student can specify a date and time, but they agree to accept that date and time if selected and to pay for that lesson.

I'm looking forward to this new adventure in training.
